Professional, perfectly prepared lectures of leading Czech and foreign researchers represent another part of the Summer School's program.

Another interesting aspect of the course is a stay in the international team. That is why we expect candidates with at least partial knowledge of the English language.

Each student receives an allowance of **4.000,- CZK**.

A hotel accommodation (usually room + separate shower and toilet) and a **full board** (breakfast, lunch, dinner) are provided by the FFPW USB.
